


FAST FACTS FROM THE 2017-18 Jordan PFHS

The 2017-18 Jordan Population and Family Health Survey (JPFHS) is designed to provide data for monitoring the population and health situation in Jordan. The 2017-18 JPFHS is the 7th Population and Family Health Survey conducted in Jordan since 1990.

Women in Jordan now have an average of **2.7 children.**


CHILDHOOD MORTALITY

I in 50 Jordanian children does not survive until their 5th birthday.

Childhood mortality has declined since 2009.

Trends in Under-5 Mortality

• MATERNAL HEALTH and NUTRITION



4 in 5 women age 15-49 attended 7+ antenatal care visits, as recommended. >1/2 of evermarried women in Jordan are overweight or obese.

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
