


## 2012-13 Pakistan Demographic and Health Survey

## **Fertility**

Pakistani women now have an average of 3.8 children. Women have 1.6 fewer children than in 1990-91.

\*1990-91 figure based on 6 years prior to the survey


### **Maternal Health**

A little over half of births are assisted by a skilled provider. Women with higher education are most likely to have their births attended by a skilled provider.

Percent of live births in the 5 years before the survey delivered by a skilled provider by mother's education




## **Vaccination Coverage**

Vaccination coverage has gradually increased in Pakistan. More than 5 in 10 children age 6-23 months are fully vaccinated.

Percent of children age 12-23 months vaccinated






## **Family Planning**

One-quarter of married women use modern contraceptive methods.

## **Child Mortality**

Infant mortality has decreased from 91 deaths per 1,000 live births in 1990-91 to current level of 74 deaths per 1,000 live births.
