


TFR for women for the 3-year period before the survey



Women marry at a median age of 20.9 and have their first birth at a median age of 22.4.


Unmet Need for Family Planning

Percent of currently married women age 15-49 with an unmet need for family planning*







Percent of currently married women



Literacy of Respondents











Use of Mosquito Nets

Percent who slept under a mosquito net the night before the survey ■ Anynet ■ITN




Knowledge of HIV Prevention Methods



Under-5 Mortality




The maternal mortality ratio in Timor-Leste is 557 deaths per 100,000 live births.







Percent of children under 5




