
#### **Trends in HIV Prevalence**


Percent of women and men age 15-49 who are HIV-positive

## Trends in Women's Participation in Decision-making


Percent of women age 15-49 who make specific decisions by themselves or jointly with their husband


# 2014 I Swanda Demographic and Health Survey

The 2014-15 Rwanda Demographic and Health Survey (RDHS) provides data for monitoring the health situation of the population in Rwanda. The 2014-15 RDHS is the 5<sup>th</sup> Demographic and Health Survey conducted in the country. The survey is based on a nationally representative sample. It provides estimates at the national and provincial levels, as well as for urban and rural areas, and for some, at the district level.



Percent of households with:




#### **Trends in Fertility**

Births per woman for the three-year period before the survey




## **Trends in Family Planning Use**

Deaths per 1,000 live births for the five-year period before the survey




#### **Trends in Maternal Health Care**

Percent of live births in the five years before the survey




### **Trends in Basic Vaccination Coverage**
