

Childhood Stunting by Region

Percent of children under five who are stunted




Disability among Adults*





2017-18 Pakistan Demographic and Health Survey (PDHS)

The 2017-18 Pakistan Demographic and Health Survey (PDHS) provides data for monitoring the health situation of the population in Pakistan. The 2017-18 PDHS is the 4th Demographic and Health Survey conducted in the country. The sample design for the 2017-18 PDHS provides estimates at the national level, for urban and rural areas, for 4 provinces, and 4 regions. The national total for indicators excludes Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit Baltistan.



Water, Sanitation, and Electricity by Residence*




Trends in Total Fertility Rate*

Births per woman for the three-year period before the survey




Modern Method Use by Region

Percent of married women age 15-49 using a modern method of family planning




Trends in Family Planning Use*
